- Please contact the business rates team if you have been unable to open your business due to disturbances or your business premises have been located within a police cordon to see if you qualify for a rates rebate for that period - details
- If you are having to relocate because of damage please contact the Economic Development Team 020 8379 3397 who will arrange for you to receive property availability advice

## **Support from Enfield Business Retailers Association (EBRA) -**

- EBRA will continue to liaise closely with businesses in the town centres. Town Centre Managers are cascading information provided by Enfield Council's Business Rates team, regarding relief on Business Rates charges for businesses prevented from trading due to the riots and those prevented from opening as they are located within the police cordon. ## **Support from Enterprise Enfield -**

- Enterprise Enfield has offered to provide business advice and support to businesses affected by the riots. (This support is available until 31/12/11). Please call 020 8443 5457.
